WILLS AND TRUSTS

You may provide for KOTO through your estate plan by naming KOTO in your will or trust. You may designate a specific dollar amount, a percentage of the estate, or a specific asset. Giving through your will or trust enables you to specify the purpose of your gift, add to a fund you already have established, and reduce your estate taxes by generating a charitable estate tax deduction.

Trusts aren't just for the wealthy. Trusts are legal mechanisms that let you put conditions on how and when your assets will be distributed upon your death. They also allow you to reduce your estate and gift taxes, and distribute assets to your heirs without the cost, delay, and publicity of probate court.

BENEFICIARY DESIGNATIONS

Naming KOTO as a beneficiary of your retirement plan, life insurance policy, or bank or brokerage account is a simple, revocable gift wherein you retain the right to change or amend the beneficiary designation. You may designate KOTO as beneficiary by completing a Change of Beneficiary form.

Giving these assets to KOTO is an excellent tax-planning strategy because distributions to KOTO are not subject to tax. Distributions made through beneficiary designations are not subject to probate.
